Tuesday - October 15th at 7 pm

Speaker: Jake Henry is new to the Savannah area, working as the Field Manager for the Savannah Tree Foundation since August of 2018. In this position, Jake focuses on coordinating tree planting and volunteer events, as well as maintaining trees after planting. He earned his Bachelor's degree in Earth Sciences from Cornell University, and his Masters in Forestry from Mississippi State University. Jake's experience with non-profit conservation organizations has helped shape how he not only conserves natural resources, but engages the community. Most recently, Jake also became an ISA Certified Arborist.

Title: Right Tree, Right Place: The Savannah Tree Foundation has a history of preserving, protecting, and planting trees across Chatham County since 1982, and one of the most important components of this work is identifying the right tree for the right place. In this presentation by STF Field Manager Jake Henry, we will learn about all of the factors that should be considered when planting a tree, and why many trees struggle in our urban environment. How big will your tree grow? What is its rooting behavior like? Is the soil of your planting site appropriate for your preferred tree species? Learn about all of this and more at the October 15th presentation!

Bird Walks, Field Trips, Surveys, Counts

Ogeechee Audubon Society offers four kinds of opportunities for members to participate in birding in the field:

Bird Walks

Bird Walks will be held monthly at various locations to provide an opportunity for birders of all levels to come together. This **self-directed** activity and has no defined leader. Everyone is expected to help each other out as one hone one's birding skills and identifies birds in the area. Sometimes when you have to figure it out for yourself – you learn more. Also, it is a chance to help others learn and to share your joy of birding! Bird Walks are open to public and birders of all skill levels and ages are welcome. Length of time about an hour to an hour and a half.

****THU, OCT 10: Second Thursday of the Month Bird Walk 8:30 AM to 9:30 AM.** University of Georgia Aquarium, Jay Wolf Nature trail on Skidaway Island. The Jay Wolf nature trail is adjacent to the Skidaway River in a maritime forest habitat with beautiful views of the salt marsh. The 0.3 mile trail includes a boardwalk over the salt marsh. Meet at Aquarium entrance. **Trip Rigor:** Easy, gravel trail is wheelchair accessible.

****THU, NOV 14: Second Thursday of the Month Bird Walk 8:30 AM to 9:30 AM.** Forsyth Park. Take a short walk in this urban park to study the trees and upper canopy for migrants and wintering resident bird species. **Trip Rigor:** Easy, terrain is sidewalk, grass, and dirt.

Field Trips

Field trips are planned **leader-directed** birding opportunities. A knowledgeable and experienced leader will assist in spotting and identifying birds in a precise habitat selected for that particular field trip. The habitat and target birds for the particular area will be outlined in the field trip description. Field trips provide not only a birding opportunity but present learning opportunities for all, especially beginning birders. Field Trips are open to the public and birders of all skill levels and ages. Length of time 2 to 3 hours.

****SUN, OCT 27: Fort Pulaski National Monument 9:00 AM to 11:30 AM.** We will search for marsh wrens, seaside sparrows, nelson sparrows, and shorebirds during a high tide. When driving into the park we will stop at several places. Meet at 9 am at park entrance, Leader: Mary Sweeney-Reeves, marshnut@comcast.net or 912-844-8988. **Trip Rigor:** Easy, with varied terrain.

****SAT, NOV 16: Chatham County Wetlands Preserve 8:00 AM to 11:00 AM.** This is a beautiful site featuring wetlands and river setting. We will search for wading birds, raptors, woodpeckers, and various sparrows. Leader: Larry Carlile, 912-224-1796, or l.carlile259@comcast.net

****SAT, NOV 23: Hutchinson Island 8:00 AM to 11:00 AM.** By this date, fall migration is in its last weeks and many winter residents have already settled in. This location provides an interesting mix of birds due to a diverse habitat that includes grasslands, wooded areas, and wetlands. Several rare species have shown up here this year and last. All beginners and families with children are welcome. Meet at the white building (community center) at 8 am. Leader: Steve Wagner, siwgnr@hotmail.com. **Trip Rigor:** Easy, walking in varied terrain.

Surveys

Surveys are conducted to gather data regarding bird populations at a defined time, in a defined area for a defined purpose. Surveys are more rigorous than bird walks or field trips. Surveys are conducted with a **specific purpose in mind and the data that is collected will be submitted by the survey leader only and shared with the participants**. These surveys are led by a core survey team. Ogeechee Audubon members are invited to participate in survey activity as citizen scientists and expected to stay for the length of the survey. Surveys are **only open to Ogeechee Audubon Members**. Length of time will vary but typically as long as 4 hours.

Waste Management - Superior Landfill Survey - 3001 Little Neck Road

SUN, OCT 6 and SUN NOV 17. Meet at gate at 8:30am sharp. Restricted area. Must be there by 8:30am. Join the survey team members to assist in data collection of the bird population. ***Ogeechee Audubon Society Members only.***

Savannah Christian Preparatory School – 1599 Chatham Parkway – Property Survey

SUN, OCT 27 and SUN NOV, 24. Meet at gate at 8:30am sharp. Restricted area. Must be there by 8:30am. Join the survey team to collect data regarding the bird population on the property. ***Ogeechee Audubon Society Members only.***

Savannah Christian Preparatory School – 1599 Chatham Parkway – Rusty Blackbirds

SUN, NOV 3, Nov 10, NOV 17, DEC 1. Meet at gate at 3pm. Restricted area. Join the survey to collect data about numbers of Rusty Blackbirds on the school property. **Ogeechee Audubon Society Members only.**

International Shorebird Survey

TBD - Currently Ogeechee Audubon contributes data to these surveys by conducting 3 surveys in the spring and three in the late summer and early fall on the north beach of Tybee Island, each during a specified 3-week window. These surveys have been completed for 2019. We will provide information on the 2020 survey dates in our spring newsletter. The ability to walk about a mile in soft, uneven sand is required. These surveys when they resume can accommodate 12 people and beginners are welcome. **Ogeechee Audubon Society Members only.** Stay tuned for opportunities to participate.

American Oystercatcher Surveys at Fort Pulaski

TBD - The Georgia DNR has recently received a permit to conduct Oystercatcher Surveys at Fort Pulaski on the beach on the north side of Cocks spur Island. We are waiting to get specific details from Tim Keyes and Abby Sterling on the exact protocol of these surveys, though they generally involve surveying the birds at high tide on 2 successive days. Participation in these surveys will be limited to no more than 4 people as risk for disturbing the birds and causing them to flush is high. Participants need to be able to walk on soft sand. Help with carrying a spotting scope and recording data is essential. It is useful to have a good camera capable of photographing banded birds. **Ogeechee Audubon Society Members only.** Stay tuned for opportunities to participate.

Counts

Basic bird counts are a good way to estimate population size, detect changes in population size or species diversity. The Christmas Bird Count (CBC) is **a census of birds in the Western Hemisphere**, performed annually in the early Northern-hemisphere winter by volunteer birdwatchers and administered by the National Audubon Society. The purpose is to provide population data for use in science, especially conservation biology, though many people participate for recreation.

Ogeechee Audubon participates each year in the National Audubon Christmas Bird Count. The two CBC areas that OAS is responsible for are Harris Neck and Savannah. Harris Neck survey occurs in late December while the Savannah survey is at the beginning of January. The public, no matter what birding skill level, is welcome to participate in both surveys.


